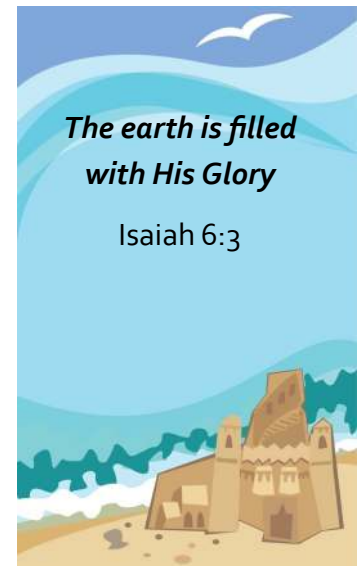

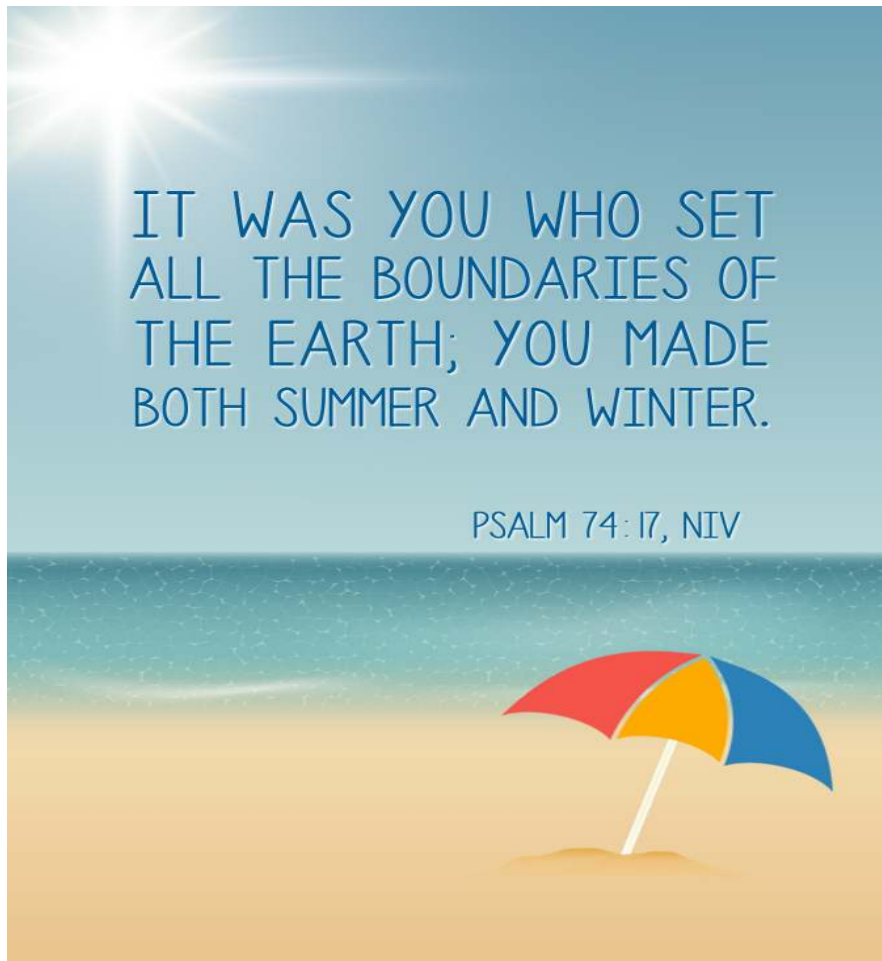

Buildings and Grounds report:

May was a very wet month. Several roof leaks required extensive repairs over the offices and the 1965 building addition, should be in good shape going forward. Planting flowers was delayed until late June. Lawn mowing has been something to keep up with for our contractor. Christoff's floor people will return August 12 thru the 16th to strip and refinish the floors in Holy Spirit Hall and the two hallways around it, hopefully this will be the last time, thank you for your patience. Lights under the balcony, 9 bulbs of which 7 were burnt out, are all lit again. Since the roof repairs, Harry Strait has been working on the stained ceiling tiles. We have replaced a few, and many can be repaired. Sue Smar continues to weed our grounds. Thank You Harry and Sue!!

Safety and Security Team Report:

Outside of normal Sundays, we had several events this past month requiring building security. The Soar dinner/program and funerals were the main events. It's SUMMER, FINALLY!!!! and that means it is time to collect beach towels for the second annual trek to Lake Michigan!!

Last year, Mission and Outreach sponsored a day trip to South Haven for our Get Real youth at the end of their summer program. We took 55 kids plus chaperones to the lake, most of whom had never seen it!! This year we are hosting TWO groups of our neighborhood kids!! We will take approximately 55 Get Real youth plus their chaperones on **Thursday, July 25**. The next week we will take 50ish Save Our Youth kids on **Wed. July 31!!**

We have doubled our numbers in one year! This trip is not simply a day at the beach. It is an opportunity for the at risk youth in our community to see that there is a big wide world outside of their small community and they are part of it, to experience the beauty of God's creation, to know that it belongs to THEM, to understand that people they don't even know (St. Paul's) care about them, to show them God's love.

We need at LEAST 100 NEW beach towels and beach toys for this trip.

Let's make this year's adventure even better than 2018 (not sure it can get much better but we will certainly try!!) The bar is quite high!!

the world and help them become more resilient and flourish.”*

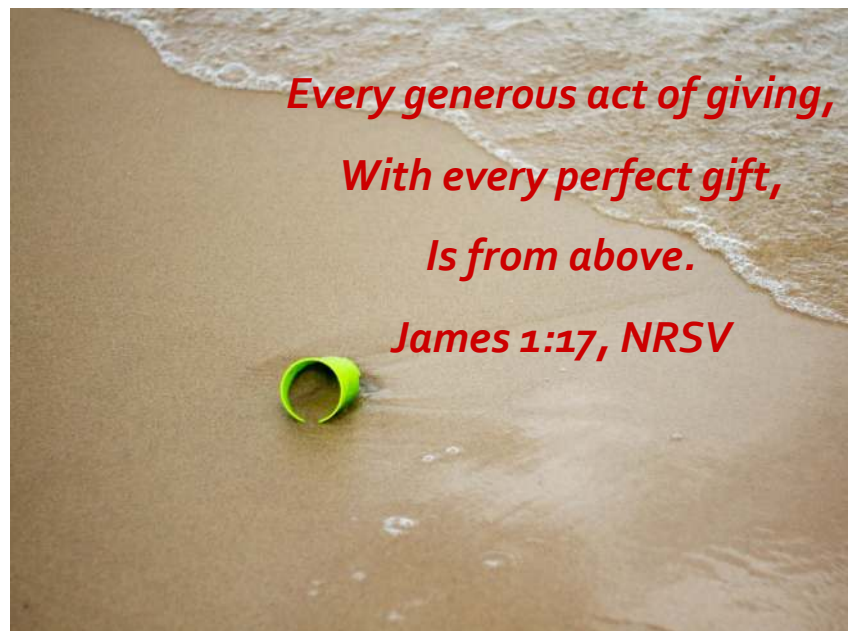
In the Diocese of West Texas, the current focus is on identifying and assisting with unmet needs for recovering households hurt as a result of Hurricane Harvey. A mini-grant program was offered to congregations in 15 affected counties.

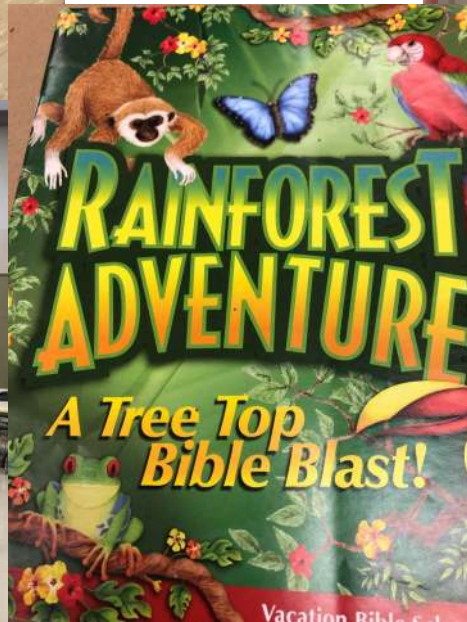
