




Preventive maintenance is being done this week changing air filters, inspecting drive belts, inspecting our equipment for possible problems in the future. City of Jackson requires annual back flow preventer water valve checks. This is to assure the City we are not letting water leak back into the public water supply. There are other items being identified as to possible problems in the future throughout our facility. All HVAC equipment is being inspected to prevent inconvenience during the colder months. There have been some items identified as needing repair. We are awaiting further information as to costs for repair. You may notice our parking lot has been seal coated and yellow stripes have been refurbished, blue stripes too on the parking lot. Yellow stripes have been repainted on the steps as well. Ice melt for side walks is in the storage closet ready for the first snow. Buildings & Grounds will continue to move forward as labor (volunteers) permit us.




We really need female choir members! If you or someone you know is interested in joining us (even part time) we would love to have you. Practices are Wednesday evenings at 6:30 pm.
