

However you keep it, please do find a way to keep Advent yourself or with family and friends this season.

The preparation of our hearts comes with our focus, even in small bursts, on the gift of Jesus Christ in our own lives. As was said by the writer of Romans, sin leads to death and we feel that in our own lives and the world around us. The degradation of our environment, the desolation of war, the dehumanization of humanity through greed, fear and envy keep death before our eyes each day. But... We have the most precious gift in the world in Jesus Christ come into the world for all of us. Sin and death are not the final answer. They have no lasting power in the world with Jesus Christ whose birth, life, death and resurrection overcome sin and death and give us life everlasting. The presence of Christ in our hearts allows us to be tuned to Him and follow Him each day. The promise of eternal life with God gives us a heavenly perspective on our earthly cares. The power of the Holy Spirit given to us helps us walk with Christ each day and love as we are so richly loved by God. Tending these realities through the practice of keeping Advent helps us experience Christmas in a deeper way and gain insight into what God is calling forth in us and our walk with Christ each day. My prayer is that each of us be filled with the Holy Spirit and the presence of Christ this season.

I am very happy to have India Treadway on our staff as Nursery Attendant taking care of our precious little ones. Terry, her husband, is our new Sexton and they are a wonderful addition to our parish staff and family. 



Mission & Outreach

Happy Advent! As we look forward to all the preparations of the season, please remember those who are struggling this year. One neighborhood organization that has had serious challenges is the Jackson Community Food Pantry at 701



Greenwood Ave. A freezer malfunction allowed frozen chicken to defrost for a full week, leading to buckets of liquified chicken to soak into the carpet, sub floor and woodwork. They are only open one day a week so by the time it was discovered, it was an enormous putrid mess. They have been closed for 5 months while they navigated the insurance red tape, replaced equipment and all the flooring, woodwork, etc.

They are open again and serve 100 families or 400 people in our neighborhood. They are in desperate need of the following items: BABY FORMULA, protein, fresh produce, bread, cereal, rice, beans, canned goods, and feminine hygiene products. They also need cash.

We have put the items needed on the Angel Tree in the glass narthex. Please take an angel (or two) purchase your items and bring them to the church before Wednesday, December 18. We will be delivering our donations on that day. Obviously, if you are purchasing frozen turkeys, meat or fresh produce other than potatoes, deliver them Monday or Tuesday, December 16-17 of that week.

We also will be receiving names of single women from the AWARE shelter who are often forgotten at this time of year. They have not given us names yet, but they will be added to the tree as soon as we get them.

Thank you from all of us on the Mission and Outreach committee! You make our job so easy because of the love and generosity you ALWAYS show toward the needy in our community. It is a privilege and honor to represent you.

We pray you all the blessings this Holy season has to offer for you and those you love.

New Coffee Hour Plans

Pastor Sarah has already sent out some information but this article is a reminder of the change in how hosting coffee hour will now work. With the hiring of a Kitchen Manager and the formation of the Kitchen Cabinet, plans are now in place to make it easier for someone interested in hosting a Sunday Coffee hour.



The **new plan for coffee hour** is for the host/hostess to bring in a sweet item for about 40-50 people. Jeremiah, our new Kitchen Manager, will prepare a tray which will consist of fruit or veggies, cheese & crackers as well as a gluten free item for our dietary restricted parishioners. The host / hostess will be responsible for making the coffee,



setting out the juice and water, and trays as well as the sweet item they bring. Sweet items can be cookies, muffins, cake, brownies, pastries or whatever you choose. This new method should reduce some of the stress previously felt by people who didn't feel comfortable participating.

In addition, we have heard comments from people who would like to donate money but don't feel comfortable serving as a hostess. We appreciate your willingness to be part of this service for our parish family. If you want to donate, please write a check and put Hospitality on the memo line or just drop it into the plate at the end of the table where food is placed. Your donation is truly appreciated and will be put toward the trays that will be prepared weekly.

We are also seeking individuals who would serve as Monthly Team Leaders to help with the organization of the coffee hosting schedule and work with the other team leaders on projects as needed to provide our parish family and guests with wonderful fellowship opportunities.

The Kitchen Cabinet will be meeting monthly on the first Tuesday of each month, so please feel free to share your concerns or questions in time for the group to address them.






