Rector's Corner

Friends,

Ecclesiastes 3:1 says "For everything there is a season,"
As the summer winds down our parents, teachers and students begin their arduous task of navigating schooling during Covid. Our prayers are with each of them as they step into the unknown but with the love of Christ surrounding

them. We are beginning our program year very differently this year. In person Christian education is not yet permitted by Covid restrictions and so I urge you to join the Adult Forum, Bible Study or the many offerings by our diocesan staff. Education on a range of topics for a large range of ages is offered currently by the Diocese of Michigan (www.edomi.org). Please look for these things online. If you don't go online I ask you to pull out your Book of Common Prayer (I can deliver one if you don't have one!) and a devotional aid of some sort. We subscribe to Forward Day by Day at St. Paul's and can help you get a subscription mailed to your home if you'd like one. We also get Our Daily Bread which is published out of Grand Rapids and is a lovely daily devotional. I can also recommend a host of books for you to read on various topics. This might be a good time to come to St. Paul's library and check something out for reading this month. Remember, your Christian education and daily prayer life is your responsibility and I'm here to help you fulfill that baptismal promise to "Continue in the apostles' teaching…and prayers."

We are currently working out a contract to hire our previous seminarian, Melissa Congleton, as curate for at least the next three years. Melissa is still an officer with Michigan State University Campus Police and will work part time with us. We are entering into a partnership with the Diocese to pay her salary/benefits. Through the McElroy fund (set up by a member of the Ford family decades ago) the Diocese will pay at least half her salary/benefits while she works with us and gets her feet wet as a priest. She is not ordained yet but is set to become a deacon of the Church on Saturday Dec. 12th. God willing, six months from then, she'll become a priest and be able to fully celebrate the Eucharist with us. Until then she will have the leading role in directing youth confirmation and children's Christian education at St. Paul's Church. Last month, Zoe Baldwin retired from heading up our Sunday School and so the time has come to change and grow the way we care for our kids. Thanks be to God for Zoe Baldwin and her decades of care for our children!

"To everything there is a season" ...change is our regular diet these days because of Covid and our national strife and it can be a fearful thing to look at our future. But we who know the Lord Jesus Christ stand on His promises to us and the generations who have known hard times before us. He is faithful! Even when the world is spinning in chaos, we find quiet strength through faith in Him and the love of neighbor. Set your feet on that rock each day and you will not be moved from it. God bless and keep you and please call on me and your Vestry for whatever you need.

St. Paul's Church Records:

Sunday, April 29, 1973 marked 25 years to the day of the Rev. Brownell's first Sunday at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, Jackson, Michigan. Also celebrating 25th Anniversaries of service are Choir Director, Charles B. 'Bert' Kressler, and Organist, John W. 'Jack' Zimmerman. All three men were hired in 1948.


